PAPER PREPARATION GUIDE

Peer-reviewed papers with the highest scientific level will be published in a Special Issue of [Nuclear Technology & Radiation Protection \(NT&RP\)](#) dedicated to the IM2020 Conference.

The reviewed papers not published in the journal will be available online in the Conference Proceedings.

NT&RP is an international scientific journal covering the wide range of disciplines involved in nuclear science and technology as well as in the field of radiation protection. NT&RP is an open access journal with an Impact Factor of 0.614 (2018).

Only original papers written in English, which have not been published previously and are not under consideration for publication elsewhere, can be submitted to the NT&RP Special Issue. Authors are exclusively responsible for the contents of their submissions, the validity of the experimental results and must make sure that they have permission from all involved parties to make the data public. Authors wishing to include figures or text passages that have been already published elsewhere are required to obtain permission from the copyright holder(s).

Manuscripts must be prepared according to the standard of the journal, following the detailed instructions stated below.

General requirements:

The volume of articles should be 6 to 10 journal pages (double column layout), including figures, tables and references.

It is required to eliminate possible grammatical or spelling errors and to conform the style and language of the manuscripts to scientific English.

Manuscripts should be submitted in Word file format (.doc, .docx).

Article structure:

Title page

A separate sheet should include data about authors: name, initial of middle name, last name, title, full postal address, email address and phone number. In case of more than one author, the address and name of the corresponding author should be marked.

Title of the paper should denote the brief contents and it should be easy to identify in bibliography.

Abstract

A short abstract of not more than 200 words is required. The abstract should state briefly the purpose of the research, the principal results and major conclusions.

Keywords

The keywords should be cited after the abstract.

Introduction

Objective of the work and relation to similar previous papers should be presented in the introduction.

Methods and procedures

Methods and procedures proposed in the scientific paper should be described in such to allow the work to be reproduced by an independent researcher.

Results and discussion

Conclusions

Results and discussion, as well as Conclusions and recommendations should be presented in separate sections.

Abbreviations and denotations

A review of applied denotations might be given at the end before citing the references. Footnotes should be omitted.

Acknowledgements

Authors' contributions

Acknowledgements and Authors' contributions should be included in separate sections at the end of article before the references.

Figures and tables:

Scanned pictures (or photographs) should be sent as a separate JPG, TIF or PCX file, not wider than 150 mm to be printed in one column or 320 mm if printed on the whole page width. Letters in the figures should be 3 mm high because of zooming the figures to 50%, line thickness should not be less than 0.2 mm. Photographs should be avoided but if indispensable they should be of high quality.

All the figures should be numbered. They should be referred to in text with respective numbers.

All the tables should be numbered referred to in text with respective numbers.

Units and math formulae:

International SI system must be applied for all physical data.

Formulae and mathematical symbols must be legible. Formulae should be numbered in ordinary brackets and given only to such extent to enable comprehension.

References:

The references should be cited as follows: number within square brackets corresponding to the number in the text, last names and first letters of the authors' first names, title, followed by data which enable the cited paper to be found (e.g. DOI).

- For papers published in journals the name of the journal in italic, volume in italic and the year of publishing in ordinary brackets, number of the issue in the volume and numbers of pages in the issue should be written.
- In case of books the title in italic should be followed by the name of the publisher, place and the year of publishing, and the number of pages in the book.
- For conference proceedings the title of the proceedings and names of the editors in ordinary brackets should be written.
